APPROVED

1. The regular meeting of the Wild Rice Watershed District Board of Managers was held on Wednesday, February 14, 2007, at the office of the District. The following members were in attendance: Joe Spaeth, Warren J. Seykora, Bob Wright, James Wagner, Sr., Diane Ista and Jim Skaurud. The following members were absent: Dave Vipond. In addition the following persons were in attendance: Attorney Elroy Hanson, Engineer Jerry Bents, Administrator Steve Dalen, Secretary Loretta Johnson, Publicist Tim Halle and Audio Recorder Royal Knutson. Also in attendance were landowners and interested property owners.
2. Chairman Seykora called the meeting to order at 8:40 a.m.
3. Agenda. A motion was made by Manager Spaeth and seconded by Manager Wright to approve the agenda for February 14, 2007. Carried.
4. Public Outreach. Administrator Dalen discussed using radio to provide information to the public, especially during times when landowners are busy with fieldwork. Dalen stated that KRJB provided an estimate which was \$5 per minute when using both the Ada and Mahnommen stations. Dalen said if Managers wanted discussions on special items they should bring it to the attention of the office. Consensus of Managers was that a previous budget would cover these costs and Dalen agreed to call the publicity committee if there were items that he felt should be brought to the radio. Providing a monthly mail out update on Project #42 was discussed. Manager Ista felt updates on the timelines and providing more information on what is discussed at meetings would be good information to provide in a newsletter. Attorney Hanson stated that the board should stay consistent with current data policy when providing this information. Dalen also stated that staff discussed scheduling an informational meeting at the Twin Valley Community Center to provide the public with information on reevaluation of the Old Twin Valley Dam and/or Twin Valley Lake and also inviting agency personnel, including the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, to provide information on permitting. Dalen stated that in the current correspondence with Congressman Peterson's office, they stated that Congressman Peterson would be following the Board's direction with the WRDA bill. Manager Ista questioned involving the COE until it is determined if funding is available and asked if the Board is not trying to answer questions before the project. Manager Skaurud stated that it would be an informational meeting, only; if a project is developed it would need to be done under the umbrella of the COE as federal funds would be used and they need to be channeled through a federal agency. Manager Ista asked Administrator Dalen if he had contacted Congressman Peterson. Dalen stated that he had discussions with Ron Harnack, RRWMB, who was meeting with Peterson on the District's behalf and Harnack indicated that Peterson intended to follow the direction of the Board with the WRDA bill. A motion was made by Manager Skaurud and seconded by Manager Wright authorizing staff to schedule the informational meeting. Carried.

5. Project #42 South Branch Storage Project. Engineer Bents gave a Power Point presentation on the process used by the District to get to the present on Project #42. With the LIDAR data now being available there may be opportunities to go upstream and also investigate alternative sites. Chairman Seykora stated that at recent meetings landowners have brought up questions on additional sites upstream and with the availability of LIDAR, the costs would be considerably less than using the traditional methods. Manager Wright stated that if landowners are raising these questions, the Managers should at least try to answer them.

Manager Ista asked about doing additional analysis of the upstream area of the Becker Dams to determine feasibility that Bill Zurn brought before the board. Zurn felt that promises had been made at the time of construction of Becker Dams regarding additional upstream storage. Engineer Bents stated that there was considerable controversy at the time the Becker Dams were built over what should be done and it appears that verbal agreements were made. Manager Wright asked Engineer Bents if he felt it would be good to look at this upper site proposed or wait for the LIDAR. Engineer Bents stated that it might be good to take a quick look at the site above but it would be more cost efficient to wait for the LIDAR information.

Engineer Bents stated that because landowners have requested further investigation into upper sites, it may be an opportunity to go to permitting folks and tell them that we have looked at the current chosen sites because they felt they were better; now the folks who own land and live in that area and are in opposition to these sites would like the District to look upstream. Attorney Hanson stated that it may be an opportunity to provide the information to both landowners and permitting folks. Manager Ista stated that the District needs to be open, and feels that landowner input has been helpful. Manager Wagner stated that a project on stream will not avoid using farmland because of the land needed to mitigate an on stream project. Engineer Bents stated that it may be nice to have the information quantified. Manager Spaeth stated that a large project comparable to a Twin Valley Dam type, would solve a lot of problems if it could be built, but maybe the district should look at more smaller projects; although they become very costly per site. A motion was made by Manager Skaurud and seconded by Manager Wright authorizing Engineer Bents to do an alternative analysis on sites between Ulen and the lower Becker Dam and do the same for the Zurn site above Becker Dam when the LIDAR for that area becomes available. Carried.

Administrator Dalen talked about the proposed landowner meetings scheduled for 6-9:00 p.m. on March 5 and March 12 at the Ulen VFW meeting room. Manager Ista felt the entire board should be at the meetings. A motion was made by Manager Ista and seconded by Manager Wagner authorizing full board attendance. Carried.

Administrator Dalen reported that he had been contacted by a landowner who wished to stay anonymous regarding the possibility of a land swap with the District for a project. A motion was made by Manager Ista and seconded by Manager Spaeth authorizing Dalen to explore the alternatives of land swaps. Carried.

The meeting was opened to public comment. Brent Kappes felt that there is a double standard because the District can take his land but will not do the same to the DNR. He also felt that property owners were kept in the dark as much as possible and the District does not have support for the project as they state. Dick Smith stated that the District is selling the project as a 30-40 percent reduction in flow and felt that is not true. Smith commented that the District should be telling both sides of the story not just the Watershed's view. Manager Ista stated that it may be time for our watershed to take a different look at how Tim Halle is hired because she receives comments from people in the District that the newspaper is not presenting both sides.

Steve Jacobson stated that he felt the public wants to be informed and it is appropriate for the District to disseminate information in the way they are doing. Administrator Dalen stated that property owners have come in the office stating that they support the project; opposition editorials have been published in area papers; and a meeting was held in Ulen as early as July of 2005; therefore stating that we are not informing the public is not true, and opposition has been shown. Manager Wagner stated that the Watershed District is mandated by law to try to do something about the flooding and that is what we are trying to do. Administrator Dalen stated that the Board is moving in the right direction and by going through the process will find out what is feasible. Manager Ista commented that landowners do not feel they are getting information in as timely manner as possible and we can look at that ourselves. David Christensen asked how many people down in the valley have been put out of business. Brian Borgen stated that he lost his farmland as a result of flooding. Christensen stated that Borgen was only one and how about everyone up where he has property. The question was raised if the landowner meetings scheduled for March 5 and 12 were necessary at this time. Dalen felt that something is always learned from landowner contact. Landowners did not want small group meetings, rather wanted attendance open because everyone is concerned.

Lawrence Pollock asked if the District would propose a dry dam or a lake at the reevaluation of the Twin Valley Project and asked why the COE had to be involved; why does the District have to fight this with all of the organizations. Manager Ista asked Pollock if he preferred a dry dam or lake. Pollock replied that that you cannot have flood damage reduction with a lake. Engineer Bents stated that in a reevaluation, the District would also be asking the COE to look at alternatives to the Twin Valley Dam that could be done in this environment; by going through the process the cost share, if approved by the COE would be at a minimum of 50/50 and could go back to the old cost share of 65/35 for a project. Manager Skaurud stated that Congressman Peterson stated in a meeting which he attended, that he preferred a dry dam and the COE would tell the District if this is feasible. Dalen stated that the District promotes the fact to all agency personnel that we promote flood damage reduction. Pollock also asked why privately owned lands that may be in the stream bottom would have to be mitigated. Engineer Bents stated that the Wetland Conservation Act (WCA) and Section 404 of the Clean Water Act require wetlands to be mitigated. Manager Spaeth stated that it is not unlike the farm program that requires following the program or not being paid. Administrator Dalen stated that the public can beat up on the Managers but nothing will change, the laws need to be changed legislatively; this is an opportunity and the perfect time to go to legislators and the people who change the rules. Chairman Seykora stated that as long as the rules are there the District must abide by them. Lawrence Pollock asked if the area west of Ulen on C.D. #18 upstream of the USFWS land could be pursued as it would make an ideal retention area. Manager Ista suggested that Pollock bring a request to the District. Chairman Seykora closed the landowner discussion at 11:00 a.m. to move on to other agenda items and property owners in attendance left the meeting.

PERMIT APPLICATIONS

6. Mattson Farms, Section 27, White Earth Township, Mahnomen County. A motion was made by Manager Skaurud and seconded by Manager Spaeth to approve Permit Application #1-10-07-1 of Mattson Farms to fill in old ditches and construct a new ditch in Section 27, White Earth Township, Mahnomen County, with the recommendation that they check with NRCS on wetland issues.
Carried.

7. Norman County Highway Department, Section 25, Lee Township. Mick Alm, Steve Jacobson and Brian Borgen met with Managers to discuss the permit application of the Norman County Highway Department for the removal of existing Bridge #5532 and the construction of Bridge #54550 along with associated approach alignment improvements in Section 25 of Lee Township on CSAH #39. Manager Ista read correspondence that she received from Terry Guttormson regarding his concerns over downstream impacts. Ista also requested additional time to review the permit. Manager Skaurud asked Engineer Bents for his recommendation and Bents recommended approval of the permit. A motion was made by Manager Skaurud and seconded by Manager Seykora to approve the permit application. Discussion followed. Manager Ista felt that an informational meeting to have landowner issues addressed was important. Managers Skaurud and Seykora felt that a recommendation to approve was provided by the consultant and the permit is reasonable, so should be approved. Manager Ista questioned Mick Alm if he had a landowner public meeting on the bridge installation. Alm stated, "not specifically." Manager Wagner stated that Managers are supposed to listen to the engineer and asked Ista about any information that she thought would be available that Engineer Bents could not provide. Steve Jacobson asked Alm if the County could lose federal funding by delaying the permit. Alm said that if it is delayed too long it could. Chairman Seykora called for a vote. Managers Skaurud and Seykora voted yes, Managers Spaeth, Wright, Ista and Wagner opposed. Motion failed due to lack of a majority.

A motion was made by Manager Ista and seconded by Manager Wright to table action on the permit until notification of a public meeting to be held at 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday, March 13, 2007, at the regular meeting of the Managers. Approved with Managers Skaurud and Seykora opposed. Carried.

8. Clearwater County Highway Department, Sections 17-20, Nora Township and Sections 13-14 & 23-24 of Falk Township. A motion was made by Manager Spaeth and seconded by Manager Wright to approve Permit Application #2-14-07-2, of the Clearwater County Highway Department to grade and surface, rework ditches to meet standards in Sections 17-20 Nora and Sections 13-14 & 23-24 of Falk Township with the condition that final plans and specifications be provided to the WRWD and that the District is notified of any culvert changes that are proposed between now and the final plan completion. Carried.

9. A motion was made by Manager Wright and seconded by Manager Wagner to recess the meeting until 1:15 p.m. for lunch. Carried. Chairman Seykora recessed the meeting at 11:45 a.m.

10. Chairman Seykora reconvened the meeting at 1:15 p.m.

11. Monthly Financial Report. Doug Marcussen presented the January 31, 2007, financial report. A motion was made by Manager Ista and seconded by Manager Spaeth to approve the January 31, 2007, financial report for entry into the record. Carried.

12. Office Equipment Upgrade. A motion was made by Manager Skaurud and seconded by Manager Wright approving an upgrade to office equipment up to \$2,500. Carried.

13. Upper Reaches Project. Discussion was held regarding the financial status of the Upper Reaches Project and information from the February 7, 2007, in which Attorney Jerry Von Korff presented the options for financing the project. Chairman Seykora stated there are probably three options, do nothing and continue in the deficit, spending only the minimum for repairs; redetermination of benefits; or establish a Water Management District (WMD). Estimated costs for redetermination benefits are approximately \$250,000 and an additional comparable cost if Project #9 were redetermined. Administrator Dalen stated that logic may help the decision making process as the cost of establishing a WMD are considerably less than redetermination and it may be prudent to authorize Engineer Bents to begin the process. Bents stated that the following options could be used when determining the amount of the assessment: taxable market value; land use and soils issues; contribution to downstream flooding; finding a mix that the board thinks is fair; bringing amendment to the District's Water Management Plan to the BWSR for approval. A motion was made by Manager Skaurud and seconded by Manager Ista authorizing Engineer Bents to begin research into the process and establishment of property fees charged for assessment to a WMD. Carried.

14. Upper Green Meadow Storage. Manager Ista stated that land in Section 18 of Strand Township, is available for a storage project, however there is a penalty to the landowner for early payoff on the loan which matures in 2½ years. Ista commented that Curt Jacobson is requesting a soils overlay which could determine if there could be a project. Chairman Seykora asked where the funds would come for the project and felt the board would need a petition by landowners or a bond before spending a considerable amount of additional money on a storage project. Engineer Bents stated that the on site clay is not suitable for building a dike, therefore clay for the dike would need to be imported. Manager Ista stated that she thought the Board agreed that the Green Meadow Dam needs retention above it and we have a possible site and a willing landowner. Attorney Hanson stated that he did not think that this could be considered a repair and at the least an improvement; clearly however, it could be added as a new project. A motion was made by Manager Ista and seconded by Manager Wright to approve expenditures in the amount not to exceed \$300 authorizing Engineer Bents to provide the soils overlay. Carried. Manager Wright stated that he didn't think the board could go along with the results determined unless all landowners on Project #30 were notified.

15. J.D. #53 Repair Section 25 of Good Hope and Section 40 of Lockhart Townships. A motion was made by Manager Spaeth and seconded by Manager Wright to authorize the repair in Sections 25 of Good Hope Township and Section 40 of Lockhart Township, along with obtaining landowner spoil releases. Carried.

16. Project #9 Repair Section 24/25 of Mary; 30/36 of Winchester and 1 of Felton Townships. Engineer Bents reported that he has begun the hydrologic study on the possible downstream impacts of the repair. Redetermination of benefits was discussed and Attorney Hanson stated that there is no procedure under 103D for redetermination of benefits at this time. A motion was made by Manager Spaeth and seconded by Manager Wright authorizing Chairman Seykora to discuss this issue with the BWSR on a state level in an attempt to change the law for these provisions. Carried.

17. Upper Felton Site. A motion was made by Manager Wagner and seconded by Manager Skaurud authorizing Engineer Bents to contact landowners in the Felton Ditch Subwatershed for the purpose of investigating the potential for alternative sites. Landowners will be asked to complete an enclosed form if they have land that they would consider using for flood water retention. Carried.

18. City of Hendrum Request. A letter from the City of Hendrum requesting to purchase the former Adam Camp property located in the N2NE4 Section 12, Range 49 of Hendrum Township which was acquired by the District with the DR 1175 Acquisition Program. A motion was made by Manager Skaurud and seconded by Manager Wagner authorizing Attorney Hanson to prepare the proper documents for the transfer of the property to the City of Hendrum. Carried.

19. University of North Dakota Energy & Environmental Research Center (EERC) Request. Engineer Bents reported that the EERC is asking the District to join the Red River Basin Consortium for a fee of \$5,000 for the purpose of addressing the Red River of the North Basin management issues with the overall goal of developing a long-term watershed management strategy and sponsor desires to participate in the activities of this program. Administrator Dalen stated that to date no other Watershed District has become involved in the consortium and it would make it unlikely that we would get our input of money back. A request was also received from the EERC proposing to identify optimal storage options within the Wild Rice River Watershed to help reduce flooding and flows along the main stem of the Wild Rice River for an estimated cost of \$43,000 for the proposed work. A motion was made by Manager Ista and seconded by Manager Spaeth to table both requests and take them under advisement at a later date. Carried.

20. City of Mahanomen Drainage Request. The City of Mahanomen requested assistance from the Watershed District in solving a drainage problem on the edge of the city. A motion was made by Manager Spaeth and seconded by Manager Wright authorizing Administrator Dalen to schedule a meeting with representatives from the City of Mahanomen and District staff to discuss the drainage problems. Carried.

21. Landowner Involvement in Proposed On Stream Retention. Manager Ista stated that in discussions with Mark Harless, he requested a document written and approved by the Watershed District to be provided to Representative Morrie Lanning concerning proposed legislation in pursuing on stream storage. Administrator Dalen stated that in discussion with Harless he indicated to him that the board does not wish to provide a resolution, rather this should be a grass routes initiative from local landowners and possibly the Concerned Citizens who are pursuing on stream storage and discussing the proposals to Representative Lanning for support for legislation. Manager Ista stated that the Concerned Citizens should be kept out of this. Dalen felt this would be a good chance for the Concerned Citizens and anyone who wants to make a difference to carry the torch in attacking the policy regarding on stream storage. Manager Wright and Engineer Bents felt the District should be a little meaningful with agencies; the Watershed needs to abide by the rules that are mandated to the DNR by law. Chairman Seykora stated that if landowners want to pursue this issue it would be great. Administrator Dalen stated that he would continue to work with Harless. A motion was made by Manager Skaurud and seconded by Manager Spaeth authorizing Manager Wright to attend meetings with Representative Lanning. Carried.

22. COE WRR Feasibility Study. Manager Wagner asked the status of the Feasibility Study. Engineer Bents stated that the COE's sediment analysis study is to be completed by the end of March.

23. Goal Setting. Administrator Dalen distributed a list of achievements made by the Board of Managers in the year of February 06-February 07. Dalen asked each Board member to review the accomplishments and bring a list of goals they would like to achieve in 2007-08 for discussion at the March meeting.

24. Project Team Meeting. A motion was made by Manager Wright and seconded by Manager Ista to schedule a Project Team meeting for Wednesday, February 28, 2007, at the District office. Carried.

PERMIT APPLICATIONS

25. Clay County Highway Department, Replace Bridge in Section 13, Georgetown Township. A motion was made by Manager Skaurud and seconded by Manager Spaeth to table the permit application awaiting the hydraulic analysis. Carried.

26. Clay County Highway Department, Replace Bridge in Section 25/30 Viding/Felton Township. A motion was made by Manager Spaeth and seconded by Manager Skaurud to table the permit application awaiting the hydraulic analysis. Carried.

27. Clay County Highway Department, Replace Bridge in Section 13/14 Georgetown Township. A motion was made by Manager Wright and seconded by Manager Spaeth to table the permit application awaiting the hydraulic analysis. Carried.

28. Duane Hanson, Section 24, Pleasant View Township. A motion was made by Manager Skaurud and seconded by Manager Wagner to approve Permit Application # 2-14-07-3 of Duane Hanson to install a trap on a field crossing culvert located in Section 24, Pleasant View Township, to be constructed in the spring of 2007. Carried.

29. John Germolus, Section 24, Mary Township. A motion was made by Manager Ista and seconded by Manager Wagner to approve Permit Application #2-14-07-4 of John Germolus to rebuild a ring dike around his farm site located in Section 24, Mary Township, construction to begin June 1, 2007, with the condition that the additional fill is not placed on the outside slope of the dike in the southwest portion of the ring dike. Carried.

30. Randy Chisholm, Section 14, Strand Township. A motion was made by Manager Spaeth and seconded by Manager Wright to table the permit application of Randy Chisholm and notify Chisholm that he needs to provide the sizes and locations of the outlet and also information on the wetland mitigation site. Carried.

31. Complaints/Violations. Engineer Bents reported on the violation by Keith Lavoie in Section 36 of Pembina Township, Mahanomen County, in which Lavoie installed blockages of a ditch/waterway on his property. Duane Pazdernik is concerned that the blocks will prevent the high water events from flowing north across the Lavoie property. At an on-site meeting with Administrator Dalen, Mark Aanenson, Lavoie and Pazdernik, Lavoie agreed to remove the two blocks in the ditch and apply for a permit from the watershed to construct a new crossing located on the south edge of the wetland area east of his farmstead. A motion was made by Manager Spaeth and seconded by Manager Wright to provide written documentation to Lavoie of the on-site agreement and request that Lavoie provide notice to the District when the blocks are removed. Carried.

32. Meeting Minutes

A motion was made by Manager Skaurud and seconded by Manager Spaeth to approve the minutes of the special meeting held at the Ulen Hall to discuss Project #42 on December 11, 2006, as distributed. Carried.

A motion was made by Manager Ista and seconded by Manager Wright to approve the minutes of the regular meeting held on December 13, 2006, as distributed. Carried.

A motion was made by Manager Wright and seconded by Manager Spaeth to approve the minutes of the reconvened meeting held on December 20, 2006, with the following changes: permit action and numbers will be added to each permit. Carried.

A motion was made by Manager Spaeth and seconded by Manager Wright to approve the minutes of the regular meeting held on January 10, 2007, with the following changes: Paragraph #6, the second to last sentence should read, "Manager Ista felt that Zurn should be given the opportunity to speak or reschedule a time for him on the agenda." Paragraph #28, add the section and township locations of the permit. Paragraph #30 add "a motion was made by Manager Wright and seconded by Manager Wagner." Carried.

A motion was made by Manager Ista and seconded by Manager to approve the minutes of the special meeting held at the Borup Hall on January 18, 2007, to discuss the petition for repair in Project #9 as distributed. Carried.

A motion was made by Manager Spaeth and seconded by Manager Wright to approve the minutes of special meeting held on February 7, 2007, to discuss the Upper Reaches Project, with the following change: on Page #2, Paragraph #2, change the word forced to encouraged. Carried.

PERMIT APPLICATIONS

33. MnDOT, Regrade T.H. #32. A motion was made by Manager Spaeth and seconded by Manager Skaurud to approve Permit Application #2-14-07-5 of MnDOT to regrade T.H. #32 beginning at the junction of T.H. #200 and T.H. #32 south to the Norman/Clay County Line. Carried.

34. Meetings/Conferences. A motion was made by Manager Wagner and seconded by Manager Spaeth authorizing Managers and staff attendance at the Red River Basin Board Meeting, March 1, 2007, at Grand Forks. Carried. A motion was made by Manager Ista and seconded by Manager Wright authorizing Managers and staff attendance at the Legislative Breakfast, March 13-15, Kelly Inn, St. Paul. Carried. A motion was made by Manager Wright and seconded by Manager Wagner authorizing Managers and staff attendance at the RRBFRD Work Group Joint Conference March 29, 2007, Northland Inn, Crookston. Carried.

35. Other Issues. Tim Halle discussed correspondence he received that was also distributed to others, which was critical of his work for the Wild Rice Watershed District. Halle stated that he wanted it made known to the Board that he works at their pleasure, he works for the District, if there is something that the Boards wants changed, he would like them to talk to him.

36. Project No. 42. A motion was made by Manager Ista and seconded by Manager Wagner authorizing Tim Halle to mail out information and news to landowners on Project No. 42. Carried.

37. There being no further business to come before the Board of Managers, a motion was made by Manager Spaeth and seconded by Manager Wright to adjourn the meeting. Carried. Chairman Seykora adjourned the meeting at 4:30 p.m.
