REGULAR MEETING
September 10, 2014
APPROVED MINUTES

1. The regular meeting of the Wild Rice Watershed District Board of Managers was held on Wednesday, September 10, 2014. Managers in attendance included: Greg Holmvik, Duane Erickson, Dean Spaeth, Mike Christensen, Curt Johannsen, Raymond Hanson, and John Austinson. In addition the following persons were in attendance: Administrator Kevin Ruud, Engineer Jerry Bents, Attorney Elroy Hanson, Tara Jensen, and various other interested taxpayers and landowners.
2. Chairman Holmvik called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.
3. Agenda Approval. A motion was made by Manager Spaeth and seconded by Manager Christensen to approve the agenda with the following additions as listed. Carried:
 - Old Business – Norman Polk Pay Request, by Engineer Bents
 - New Business – Project 20, by Engineer Bents
 - New business – Tiling Article, by Manager Erickson
 - New Business – Side Inlets, by Manager Erickson
 - Permits – Clarification on Boman Dahl Permit, by Manager Erickson
4. Approval of Billings. A motion was made by Manager Spaeth and seconded by Manager Christensen to approve the payment of billings as presented, with the addition of a bill from Renae Kappes for office cleaning in the amount of \$120.00. Carried.
5. Meeting Minutes. A motion was made by Manager Johannsen and seconded by Manager Christensen to approve the regular monthly meeting minutes dated August 13, 2014, and the special meeting minutes dated August 27, 2014. Carried.
6. Financial Report. A motion was made by Manager Austinson and seconded by Manager Spaeth to approve the monthly financial report dated August 31, 2014, and the following transfers from unassessed projects to the Red River Construction and Survey and Data accounts. Carried.

7. Open Mic. Nobody spoke at this time.

8. Community Flood Control Levee Projects. Engineer Bents updated the Managers on gateway structure improvements starting in Hendrum. The City of Perley will have some reseeding of its levee done when the weather cooperates. Land acquisition is continuing in Halstad. The deadline for levee recertification is approaching, however due to the continuing work taking place, more time will be provided before any action is taken regarding the flood plain mapping.

9. Lower Wild Rice. Administrator Ruud stated that himself, Engineer Bents, Henry Van Offelen and Jamison Wendell will be presenting information to the Lessard Sams Outdoor Heritage Council on Thursday, September 11, 2014, at 2:40 pm. Manager Erickson expressed concerns of increased maintenance expenses from potentially acquired land. Engineer Bents replied that final details have not yet been reached and there is a possibility that the land can be leased to individuals, who would take care of maintenance on the property.

10. Goose Prairie Marsh Enhancement Project. Administrator Ruud stated that Van Offelen is checking into whom with the DNR will complete the Environmental Assessment Worksheet. We are waiting for a response.

11. Rockwell Dam. Outlet improvements will be completed pending approval of a DNR permit application.

PERMIT APPLICATIONS

12. A motion was made by Manager Austinson and seconded by Manager Hanson to approve the following permits with conditions as listed. Carried:

- Andrew Borgen, Section 27, Halstad Twp. Permit #9-10-14-1 to lower two driveway culverts with the condition that the culverts are not placed lower in elevation than pipe C as shown on the permit application.
- Andrew Borgen, Section 18, Winchester Twp. Permit #9-10-14-2 to lower a centerline culvert 0.6 feet.

13. A motion was made by Manager Hanson and seconded by Manager Johannsen to approve the following permits with conditions as listed. Adjacent landowner Doug Umphrey was in attendance and asked questions regarding impacts during spring flooding events. Carried:

- Jeff Opsahl, Section 34, Wild Rice Twp. Permit #9-10-14-20 to install subsurface drain tile with standard tile conditions and the condition that the applicant prove approval for the project from the Agassiz Recreational Trail (ART) and the landowners in the SW1/4 SW1/4 of Section 34 of Wild Rice Township.
- Jeff Opsahl, Section 34, Wild Rice Twp. Permit #9-10-14-21 to deepen the ditch on the east side of the ART and lower an 18" culvert in a driveway with the condition that the applicant provide approval for the project from the ART and the landowners in the SW1/4 SW1/4 of Section 34 of Wild Rice Township.

14. Andrew Borgen asked for an amendment to previously approved permits. He would like to extend the culvert lengths due to sloughing concerns. A motion was made by Manager Austinson and seconded by Manager Hanson to amend Permit #9-10-14-1 and Permit #9-10-14-2 to allow for installation longer culverts of the same diameter.

15. A motion was made by Manager Hanson and seconded by Manager Christensen to approve the following permits with conditions as listed. Manager Johannsen asked questions regarding the increase in culvert size on Permit #9-10-14-15. Administrator Ruud and Engineer Bents stated that due to the proximity to the Red River of the North, it was determined that impacts would not be brought forth by the increase in culvert size. Carried:

- Gerald Chisholm, Section 32, Strand Twp. Permit #9-10-14-4 to install a field approach and culvert with the condition that the culvert is an 18" diameter pipe.
- Halstad Township, Section 24, Halstad Twp. Permit #9-10-14-14 to replace an existing 24" culvert with a longer 24" culvert.
- Halstad Township, Section 24, Halstad Twp. Permit #9-10-14-15 to replace an existing 24" culvert with a longer 48" culvert.
- Evan Hellerud, Section 9, Halstad Twp. Permit #9-10-14-16 to install a new field approach with a 24" culvert.
- Beau Jacobson, Section 17, Atlanta Twp. Permit #9-10-14-18 to install subsurface drain tile for a two year term with standard tile conditions.
- Keith Kirsch, Sections 34 and 35, Chief Twp. Permit #9-10-14-19 to construct wetland restorations.
- Dean Pederson, Section 35, Strand Twp. Permit #9-10-14-22 to install a field approach and culvert with the condition that the culvert is an 18" diameter pipe.

16. Rudy Braseth, Section 16, Ulen Twp. A motion was made by Manager Hanson and seconded by Manager Christensen to approve Permit #9-10-14-3 to install subsurface drain tile with standard tile conditions. Carried.

17. Manager Christensen retreated to the audience.

18. Mike Christensen, Section 22, Fossum Twp. A motion was made by Manager Hanson and seconded by Manager Spaeth to approve Permit #9-10-14-5 to install subsurface drain tile with standard tile conditions. Carried.
19. Manager Christensen returned to the board table. Manager Erickson retreated to the audience.
20. Duane Erickson, Section 11, Home Lake Twp. A motion was made by Manager Hanson and seconded by Manager Johannsen to approve Permit #9-10-14-6 to install subsurface drain tile with standard tile conditions. Carried.
21. Darin Erickson, Section 6, Walworth Twp. A motion was made by Manager Hanson and seconded by Manager Johannsen to table Permit #9-10-14-7 to install subsurface drain tile. Engineer Bents stated that concerns were brought forth by adjacent property owners – USFWS and Schneiderman Brothers. The permit application was tabled pending field review of issues by staff with landowner in S1/2 of Section 1 of Ulen Twp, staff review of concerns from USFWS and a detailed tile plan is provided by the applicant and approved by WRWD staff or the permit is approved with standard tile conditions if the applicant provides documentation of approval from the landowner in s1/2 of Section 1 of Ulen Twp, USFWS, and a detail tile plan is provided by the applicant and approved by the WRWS staff. Carried.
22. Darin Erickson, Section 7, Flom Twp. A motion was made by Manager Hanson and seconded by Manager Spaeth to approve Permit #9-10-14-8 to install subsurface drain tile with standard tile conditions. Carried.
23. Duane Erickson, Sections 1 & 2, Walworth Twp. A motion was made by Manager Hanson and seconded by Manager Christensen to approve Permit #9-10-14-9 to install an 18” culvert near a Texas crossing for a two year term with the conditions that the project will not result in any change to the existing roadway profile and overflow elevations. Manager Johannsen asked if Erickson had Township approval to complete the work. Erickson stated that he will be attending the Township meeting on the evening of September 10th to ask for approval. Carried.
24. Duane Erickson, Section 8, Walworth Twp. A motion was made by Manager Hanson and seconded by Manager Johannsen to approve Permit #9-10-14-10 to install subsurface drain tile for a two year term with standard tile conditions. Carried.
25. Duane Erickson, Section 25, Home Lake Twp. A motion was made by Manager Hanson and seconded by Manager Christensen to table Permit #9-10-14-11 to install subsurface drain tile and notice the SW1/4 of Section 25 of Home Lake Township or the permit is approved for a two year term with standard tile conditions if the applicant provides written approval from the landowners noticed. Carried.
26. Duane Erickson, Section 7, Spring Creek Twp. A motion was made by Manager Johannsen and seconded by Manager Spaeth to table Permit #9-10-14-12 to install a field crossing with a 42” diameter concrete pipe and a 30” diameter plastic pipe to request an analysis on the pipe sizing and details of the crossing installation including overflow sections. Applicant asked for a two year term on application. Erickson asked Engineer Bents how to complete this analysis. Engineer Bents directed Erickson to contact the local county SWCD office for assistance in meeting the request. Carried.
27. Duane Erickson, Section 9, Walworth Twp. A motion was made by Manager Hanson and seconded by Manager Christensen to approve Permit #9-10-14-13 to install subsurface drain tile for a two year term with standard tile conditions and the condition that the cover over the tile does not exceed the elevation of the invert of “Pipe A” as shown on the attachment of the permit application. Carried.

28. Manager Erickson returned to the Board table.

29. Beau Jacobson, Section 17, Atlanta Twp. A motion was made by Manager Hanson and seconded by Manager Johannsen to approve Permit #9-10-14-17 to install subsurface drain tile for a two year term with standard tile conditions. Carried.

30. Jeff Opsahl asked the Board for direction in obtaining permission from the ART for Permit #9-10-14-1 and Permit #9-10-14-2. Manager Erickson suggested contacting Engineer Tom Knakmuhs with the Norman County Highway Department for assistance.

31. Boman Dahl. Manager Erickson asked for clarification regarding approved Permit #8-13-14-40. Erickson stated at the June Regular Board Meeting, Permit #6-11-14-3 was approved pending signatures from the adjacent landowners. The applicant's agent, John Voz, returned to the July Board Meeting and was joined by adjacent landowner Mike Nogowski who opposed the project and was unwilling to sign the permit. Voz and Nogowski returned to the August Regular Board Meeting with Voz asking the board to reconsider the June Permit application with amendments to ensure all construction occurs at least 200 feet from Nogowski's property line as well as the installation of a berm to control possible overflow on the west side of the project. Erickson asked for clarification on why the original conditions were changed. Administrator Ruud stated that an amended permit was returned to address issues. Engineer Bents stated this is a reason why secondary conditions are being listed on approved/tabled permits to ensure that the Board has the ability to act on them if signatures are not received. Administrator Ruud added that Nogowski was notified that an amended permit application was being considered.

32. Green Meadow Project Team. Administrator Ruud stated that currently we are waiting for approval of Concurrence Point #2. The document was submitted to the Corps on June 18, 2014. Attempts were made to schedule a meeting with the Corps when Engineer Bents and Administrator Ruud were going to be in the cities for the Lessard Sams Presentation, however they were unsuccessful. Administrator Ruud continued that the next Project Team meeting will be postpone from September 24 to October 22. Manager Johannsen suggested that the Project Team wait to meet until November due to potential scheduling conflicts with the late harvest season.

33. Proposed Model Rules Update. Manager Erickson stated that he felt the existing Rules were sufficient and he would second any motion brought forth to adopt the existing rules. A motion was made by Manager Hanson and seconded by Manager Erickson to adopt the existing rules as written. Manager Johannsen pointed out that the existing rules are currently 22 years old. He felt that while they are well written, they could use some updating. Manager Erickson felt that the updates should be brought forth by the WRWD staff and not the RRWMB. Manager Johannsen pointed out that the RRWMB is only offering suggestions for Districts to consider. Chairman Holmvik added that the RRWMB developed the Proposed Model Rules Update in an effort to create unity between Watershed Districts. Each District was asked to consider the information and change the content to best fit the needs of their individual Districts. Engineer Bents continued by saying that the draft document presented takes both the existing and the proposed model rules and created a document that better meets the current needs of the District. Manager Hanson asked to withdraw his motion. Attorney Hanson stated that since there is a second, both the motion and the second would have to be withdrawn. Administrator Ruud clarified that the discussion of updating the rules began two years ago when the discussion of updating the permit application took place. At that time another District Administrator suggested that a proposed model rules document be created for consideration by all Districts. A request to withdraw the motion on the table was presented by Managers Hanson and Erickson. Motion withdrawn. Manager Johannsen suggested that the discussion be tabled until the October Regular Board Meeting.

34. Becker SWCD South Branch CWF Application. Ed Musielewicz with the Becker County NRCS office presented an application to the Board for funding assistance for the CWF Application along the South Branch of the Wild Rice River. He stated that studies have determined what areas would be best fit for BMP practices. The Becker County SWCD is asking the District to be a funding partner up to \$25,000. Payment to participants would depend on which practices they implement and their location within the District. Chairman Holmvik asked what amount the SWCD is contributing towards the program. Musielewicz stated that the SWCD's contribution would be in kind. Not all services provided by the SWCD would be covered by the grants, therefore the SWCD would put forth unreimbursed time towards the program. Musielewicz added that the District's contribution would be paid directly to the landowner, not to the SWCD. He added that the time frame for the grant would be a two year term with a one year extension to complete work in progress. Manager Johannsen expressed concern regarding other SWCD offices coming forward expecting the same contribution, therefore he did not feel this was simply a \$25,000 contribution to just the Becker County SWCD, but the Board would be expected to fill requests from other SWCD offices in a similar manner. Engineer Bents stated that the Buffalo Red River Watershed District asks an interested party to petition for an ad valorem levy to raise the funds to meet request such as this one.

35. Budget Hearing. Chairman Holmvik called the budget hearing to order at 10:30 am.

36. Becker SWCD South Branch CWF Application (continued). Engineer Bents continued that an interested party could be a county commission or other representative. A motion was made by Manager Hanson and seconded by Manager Erickson to approve funding assistance for the Becker County SWCD South Branch CWF Application in the amount of \$25,000 for a term of two years. Manager Spaeth asked who decides how the \$25,000 is distributed. Musielewicz responded that the Becker County SWCD and NRCS offices would determine how the funds are spent. Manager Johannsen stated that he would like to think more long term than this and thought having someone petition an ad valorem levy would be a good way to do this. Musielewicz responded that the grant application is due at the end of September. The motion passed with Manager Johannsen voting against.

37. Budget Hearing (continued). A motion was made by Manager Hanson and seconded by Manager Johannsen to adopt the levys as follows (the information is contained at the end of this document). Carried.

38. Rinke Noonan Letter. Administrator Ruud presented a news article printed in the September 10, 2014 *Forum* titled "US House passes bill blocking Waters of the US Rule". Chairman Holmvik added that the Senate currently has not taken action on the proposed legislation. Attorney Hanson stated that after reviewing the letter presented by Rinke Noonan, he feels that it is a very well drafted document which accurately addresses the concerns that the Watershed has with the proposed legislation. He recommends offering support of the letter as written. A motion was made by Manager Hanson and seconded by Manager Erickson to send Rinke Noonan Board support of the letter as written. Carried.

39. Per Diems. A motion was made by Manager Spaeth and seconded by Manager Hanson to approve payment of Manager per diems and expenses as distributed. Carried.

40. Norman Polk. A motion was made by Manager Hanson and seconded by Manager Christensen to approve Pay Request #3 from Gordon Construction for work done on project clean out in the amount of \$8,775.00. Carried.

41. Project 20. Engineer Bents stated that a steel pipe in a crossing needs replacing. The estimated cost of the repairs is \$100,000. A motion was made by Manager Hanson and seconded by Manager Johannsen to approve advertisement for bids to complete necessary repairs. Carried.

42. Tiling Letter, Side Inlets, Peak Flows. Manager Erickson distributed an article published in *Progressive Farmer* regarding tiling practices. He asked Administrator Ruud if a higher peak or longer flow is more beneficial to flooding situations. Administrator Ruud stated that he is unclear on which one is more beneficial as they both have their advantages and disadvantages. Manager Erickson continued by stating that he felt the District should assist in costs for applicants that are willing to assist trickle tubes in projects they are applying for.

43. Manager Hanson left the meeting at 11:00 am.

44. AED Purchase. Administrator Ruud presented the Board with two bids for AED equipment. Following a medical emergency during a RRWMB held at the Wild Rice Watershed District office in May, the RRWMB obtained quotes from Sanford First Aid and Safety for onsite AED equipment and distributed the quotes to District offices. Manager Spaeth suggested that the discussion be tabled to allow Managers time to review the information at home. Discussion will continue at the October Regular Board Meeting.

45. Manager Christensen presented a question regarding the funding approved for the SWCD application and the amount of projects that would be installed. Engineer Bents stated that his interpretation was that the goal was to install up to 45 possible projects with the funds.

46. There being no further business to come before the Board of Managers, a motion was made by Manager Christensen and seconded by Manager Spaeth to adjourn the meeting. Carried. Chairman Holmvik adjourned the meeting at 11:09 am.
